For Maronites, as with all the eastern Churches, receiving Communion is reserved for those Christians who are properly prepared to receive the Sacrament.

for those of the Orthodox and some of the Byzantine Churches, infants are given the Eucharist at Baptism. So many of the little children coming to our Church are receiving Communion by nature, in other words, by natural practice. even though we allow Christians of the Orthodox Faith to receive; by law of their Churches they should not. That is a matter of conscience.

One important matter for us is readiness. In other words just because you are a baptized Catholic does not give you the right to receive the Eucharist without being properly catechized and in the state of Grace. The Sacrament of Reconciliation plays an important part here. If you have missed Liturgy on Sunday or any of the major feasts of the Church without good reason, you should not receive Communion until you have gone to Confession.

something else that many pass over is the practice of fasting. Our law prohibits us to receive if we have not fasted for at least one hour before receiving. the only thing that is accepted is if one must take medicine at certain times and may have to have a piece of bread as not to be ill from the medicine. But that is really the only exception.

Communion should not be abused. What I mean is that if you attend three Liturgies in one day you may not take the Eucharist at all three Liturgies. A good example when you are allowed to take Eucharist twice would be if you went to morning Liturgy as a regular practice, then you went to the Vigil Liturgy for either Sunday or a Feast Day. In that instance you may receive twice. The more you receive in a day does not heap on graces and indulgences. So please do not do that.

When approaching the Priest or Deacon or Subdeacon you should come with yur hands clasped together or over your heart. Men and young children should never have their hands in their pockets or to their sides. After receiving you should make the sign of the Cross before going back to your pew. Never, and I mean NEVER, talk to people in the Communion line especially after receiving Jesus. Go back to your pew and either stand or kneel in reverence and say a prayer of Thanksgiving.

I hope that these simple, yet important acts of "etiquette", become true sincere acts of piety for your personal spiritual growth.
