Dear Parishioners and Friends:

Liturgy, as we know, affects or senses; smell, sound, sight, touch and taste. These things or happenings are done on purpose to help draw us in closer to the worship service as well as to entice us to have a better experience of our 'prayer'.

For instance if all we did is recite the Liturgy it would be mundane, plain and unattractive. Music and the various melodies help set the mood of our liturgical celebration. Sometimes the music is joyful and at other times it is somber; both befitting the liturgical celebration (i.e. a wedding or a funeral).

The use of incense, an integral part of our liturgical experience is also important. Incense is used in all the liturgies of the Church, both East and West. Incense, in particular for us, has various meanings. The Introduction to the Qorbono mentions three:

A) praise of the Lord; this meaning came from the custom in the Roman Empire of burning incense before the image of a god, or of a deified emperor;

B) purification, covering up the foul stench of sin, and

C) forgiveness. Especially these last two are seen clearly in the Hoosoyo: as we acknowledge our sinfulness, we seek to be pardoned and purified to heed the lessons of the Word of God.

On Sunday, November 12th, immediately following the 11:30 am Liturgy, all Lebanese citizens will be able to vote in the Lebanese General Elections of 2018 without having to travel to Lebanon.

The Lebanese parliament passed a new electoral law recently, and a mechanism was established to register to vote from the USA with the deadline of November 20, 2017.

Tony Faddoul, along with Christiane Merhej and Norma Haddad, will be on hand to answer all your questions on Sunday, November 12th. Tony represents the Elections Central Committee at the Lebanese American Council for Democracy - LACD, and they are working on getting as many to register and practice their right to vote from the USA.
