Dear Beloved Parishioners at Our Lady of Lebanon:

The 12 verses of Luke 5: 1-11 describing Jesus calling his first apostles to follow him carry many details that spoke to me on several levels. The word of God must challenge us every time we open the Scriptures and start reading, praying, or meditating upon it.

When we are taken so much by what we are doing and most times focusing on our failure- cleaning the nets that caught nothing - this prevents us from seeing the great things that are happening around us - Jesus talking to the crowds and teaching them on the shore of the Sea of Galilee. But Jesus behaves in a way that surprises us and we do not expect it. He could have reacted in a way that most of us do by either ignoring and passing by the disciples who did not want to be among the crowd listening to his word, or he could have reprimanded them on their manners. However, unexpectedly, Jesus got into their boat and boldly asked Simon to sail. Luke 5: 3 reads, *"He [Jesus] got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little way from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat."* Simon, who was ready to go home and call it a day, heard Jesus telling him to come back on board and set sail again because he wanted to take a little ride on the Sea of Galilee. Peter had to gather all his forces after a long disappointing night and set sail again. There is no doubt that he was tired, but out of courtesy, he must have said to himself "It is just a little way from the shore and we'll be back shortly." Now his face must have fallen off when he saw Jesus getting very comfortable as he sat down and started teaching the crowds from the boat. Simon who was trying to avoid hearing Jesus is now with Jesus in the same boat and cannot escape his presence and teaching.

When we do not want to hear his word, Jesus will find a way not only to get us to listen to him, but also for us to hear him first hand with premium tickets in the front row, so we are not distracted.

Once Jesus was in the boat, was the crowd still able to hear him above the noise of the tide breaking on the shore and the water hitting the walls of the boat? Yes, the passage says that Jesus taught the crowds, who might have heard some of what he said, but in my opinion, the teaching was primarily addressed to Simon. It was a private tutoring session, a pep talk, given to Simon by Jesus, and moments like these will be repeated between the two. In our lives, intimate moments, like the ones described above between Jesus and Simon, also happened to us. Next week, I will describe one of these in my journey to become a priest.

Ninth Sunday of the Season of Pentecost
Second Letter to the Corinthians 5:20-21-6: 1-10

We are ambassadors for Christ, since God is making his appeal through us; we entreat you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

As we work together with him, we urge you also not to accept the grace of God in vain. For he says, 'At an acceptable time I have listened to you, and on a day of salvation I have helped you.' See, now is the acceptable time; see, now is the day of salvation! We are putting no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, but as servants of God we have commended ourselves in every way: through great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, beatings, imprisonments, riots, labors, sleepless nights, hunger; by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, holiness of spirit, genuine love, truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; in honor and dishonor, in ill repute and good repute. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; as unknown, and yet are well known; as dying, and see we are alive; as punished, and yet not killed; as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing everything.

Ninth Sunday of the Season of Pentecost !
The Gospel of Saint Luke 4:14-21

Then Jesus, filled with the power of the Spirit, returned to Galilee, and a report about him spread through all the surrounding country. He began to teach in their synagogues and was praised by everyone.

When he came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, he went to the synagogue on the Sabbath day, as was his custom. He stood up to read, and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was given to him. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where it was written: 'The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor.' And he rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant, and sat down. The eyes of all in the synagogue were fixed on him. Then he began to say to them, 'Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing.'

وَكَانَ يُعَلِّمُ فِي مَجَامِعِهِمْ، وَالْجَمِيعُ يُمَجِّدُونَهُ.

وَجَاءَ يَسُوعُ إِلَى النَّاصِرَةِ، حَيْثُ نَشَأَ، وَدَخَلَ إِلَى الْمَجْمَعِ

ثُمَّ طَوَى الْكِتَابَ، وَأَعَادَهُ إِلَى الْخَادِمِ، وَجَلَسَ. وَكَانَتْ عِيُونُ
جَمِيعِ الَّذِينَ فِي الْمَجْمَعِ شَاخِصَةً إِلَيْهِ.

فَبَدَأَ يَقُولُ لَهُمْ: «الْيَوْمَ تَمَّتْ هَذِهِ الْكِتَابَةُ الَّتِي تَلَيْتُ عَلَى
مَسَامِعِكُمْ.»
