Dear Beloved Parishioners

During their stay at the Cathedral last week, the four seminarians from Lebanon, who belong to our Eparchy and, with God's grace, will become priests in the next three to four years depending on their years of study, had the opportunity to see some famous sites in New York.

From the minute I welcomed them at the airport Sunday before last, I kept telling them that this is a new beginning and a new experience for them. Embracing this new reality, that they discerned and chose calls for a spirit of humbleness to empty themselves to be filled with the attitude of a missionary disciple for the Lord, who will be journeying with them. I assured them that there will be hard times and difficulties especially in the beginning, but the service of God's people is greater than the hardships that will be faced.



The most impressive visit we made was last Tuesday to St. Patrick's Cathedral in Manhattan. With Jane Gill, a parishioner from the Cathedral who

was our guide, we took the R train to the 49th Street Station and walked to the Cathedral. The main purpose of the visit was to pray before the shrine St. Sharbel newly dedicated by Patriarch Bechara Peter Cardinal Rai in October 2017. All of us stood in awe before the huge fabulous mosaic of St. Sharbel reminding us of the eremitical monastic life of the Maronite Church. Implicitly, this gave the four seminarians a sense of familiarity with their new state in life: St. Sharbel, one of their countrymen, had preceded them and now is welcoming them to their new mission in the United States.

Inside the shrine, there is a little niche with first class relics of the Saint where one person at a time can go in to pray alone. In one of the busiest and noisiest cities in the world, the architect was able to create a little cell to remind us of the hermit's cell in Annaya, Lebanon. For a few minutes, each one of us lived as a hermit and honored the relics of St. Sharbel.

Armed with the blessings and intercessions of St. Sharbel, Adib, Antony, Imad, and Wassim are settling into their seminaries. Keep them in your prayers

Fourteenth Sunday of Pentecost

First Letter to the Thessalonians 2:1-13

You yourselves know, brothers and sisters, that our coming to you was not in vain, but though we had already suffered and been shamefully maltreated at Philippi, as you know, we had courage in our God to declare to you the gospel of God in spite of great opposition. For our appeal does not spring from deceit or impure motives or trickery, but just as we have been approved by God to be entrusted with the message of the gospel, even so we speak, not to please mortals, but to please God who tests our hearts. As you know and as God is our witness, we never came with words of flattery or with a pretext for greed; nor did we seek praise from mortals, whether from you or from others, though we might have made demands as apostles of Christ. But we were gentle among you, like a nurse tenderly caring for her own children. So deeply do we care for you that we are determined to share with you not only the gospel of God but also our own selves, because you have become very dear to us. You remember our labor and toil, brothers and sisters; we worked night and day, so that we might not burden any of you while we proclaimed to you the gospel of God. You are witnesses, and God also, how pure, upright, and blameless our conduct was towards you believers. As you know, we dealt with each one of you like a father with his children, urging and encouraging you and pleading that you should lead a life worthy of God, who calls you into his own kingdom and glory.

We also constantly give thanks to God for this, that when you received the word of God that you heard from us, you accepted it not as a human word but as what it really is, God's word, which is also at work in you believers.

The Gospel to Saint Luke 10: 38-42

Now as they went on their way, he entered a certain village, where a woman named Martha welcomed him into her home.

She had a sister named Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet and listened to what he was saying. But Martha was distracted by her many tasks; so she came to him and asked, 'Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me to do all the work by myself? Tell her then to help me.'

But the Lord answered her, 'Martha, Martha, you are worried and distracted by many things; there is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part, which will not be taken away from her.
