Dear Beloved Parishioners

Last Sunday we had the Religious Education Open House with the students, teachers and parents. As in everything, some are eager about Sunday School, others not as much. There are, in fact, two arguments that I hear from students, teachers and parents. The first argument comes from teachers and parents who say "One hour a week is not enough; we must do more." Contrary to this, the students argue, "We have school all week long and you want us to go to school on Sunday. THIS IS NOT FAIR." The teachers will always feel there is not enough time to finish all the chapters. The students, on the other hand, believe that this is too much for them.

This conflict reminds me of the story of a married farmer who was poor. One day, he heard that the king was coming to visit the town where he lived. On that day, the farmer woke up early and put on the best clothes he had to go out and meet the king. His wife gave him a handful of grains of wheat, so he could eat them on the road or if the king did not arrive on time. Since he left his house early, the farmer was able to stand in a place where he could be very close to the king's carriage as he passed. When the king arrived riding in his fancy carriage with people on both sides of the road singing in his honor, he stopped where the farmer was standing. At that moment, the king opened the door of his carriage and extended his hand to the farmer like he was begging. In fear and trembling, the farmer reached into his pocket and gave the king about ten grains of wheat. No words were exchanged between the two, which baffled the farmer and made him wonder. On his way back home, the farmer felt upset because it was for the king to give to the poor and not the other way around. When he got home and was changing his clothes, as he was trying to empty his pockets of the grains of wheat that were left, he discovered ten gold grains among the rest. Upon this discovery, he said to himself, "I wish I had given the king all the grains of wheat that I had in my pocket." The farmer was happy because he now possessed some gold, but he was also sad because he could have had more.

Parents and priests would agree with the teachers that one hour a week is not enough, but this hour in God's wisdom is transformed into a lot more than we may think. It becomes one "golden" hour. When students realize where this hour could take them in their relationship with their Creator and its real importance in their lives, might they be willing to invest even more than one hour a week? And might they not feel guilty that they had not "invested" more time?


Sajj Breakfast November 11

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The Seventh Sunday after The Cross
The Letter to the Romans 12: 9-21

Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good; love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honor. Do not lag in zeal, be ardent in spirit, serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints; extend hospitality to strangers. Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. Live in harmony with one another; do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly; do not claim to be wiser than you are. Do not repay anyone evil for evil, but take thought for what is noble in the sight of all. If it is possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all. Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave room for the wrath of God; for it is written, 'Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord.'

No, 'if your enemies are hungry, feed them; if they are thirsty, give them something to drink; for by doing this you will heap burning coals on their heads.' Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.

The Gospel according to Saint Matthew 25: 31-46

'When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will sit on the throne of his glory. All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats, and he will put the sheep at his right hand and the goats at the left. Then the king will say to those at his right hand, "Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me." Then the righteous will answer him, "Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?" And the king will answer them, "Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me."

Then he will say to those at his left hand, "You that are accursed, depart from me into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels; for I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me nothing to drink, I was a stranger and you did not welcome me, naked and you did not give me clothing, sick and in prison and you did not visit me." Then they also will answer, "Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison, and did not take care of you?" Then he will answer them, "Truly I tell you, just as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to me." And these will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life.'

يا إخوتي، لئلا تكون محبةكم بلا رياء: تحببوا الشر، ولازموا الخير. أحبوا بعضكم بعضاً محبةً أخويةً، وبادروا بعضكم بعضاً بالإكرام.

كونوا في الاجتهاد غير متكاسلين، وبالروح حارين، وللرب عابدين،

وبالرجاء فرحين، وفي الضيق ثابتين، وعلى الصلاة مواظبين، وفي حاجات القديسين مشاركين، وإلى ضيافة الغرباء ساعين.

باركوا الذين يضطهدونكم، باركوا ولا تلعنوا. افرحوا مع الفرحين، وآكوا مع الباكين.

كونوا متففين بعضكم مع بعض، متواضعين لا متكبرين. لا تكونوا حكماً في عيون أنفسكم.

ولا تبادلوا أحداً شراً بشراً، واعتنوا بعمل الخير أمام جميع الناس. سالموا جميع الناس، إن أمكن، على قدر طاقتكم.

لا تنتقموا لأنفسكم، أيها الأحباء، بل اتركوا مكاناً لغضب الله، لأنه مكتوب: «لي الانتقام، يقول الرب، وأنا أجازي.»

ولكن «إن جاع عدوك فأطعمه، وإن عطش فأسقه، فإنك بفعلك هذا تترك على رأسه جمر نار.»

لا تدع الشر يغلبك، بل أغلب الشر بالخير.

إنجيل القديس متى 46: 31-25

قال الرب يسوع: «متى جاء ابن الإنسان في مجده، وجميع الملائكة معه، يجلس على عرش مجده.

وتجمع لديه جميع الأمم، فيميز بعضهم من بعض، كما يميز الراعي الخراف من الجداء.

ويقيم الخراف عن يمينه والجداء عن شماله.

حينئذ يقول الملك للذين عن يمينه: تعالوا، يا مباركي أبي، رثوا الملكوت المعد لكم منذ إنشاء العالم؛

لأني جعت فما أطعمتموني، وعطشت فما سقيتموني، وكنت غريباً فما أويتموني، وعرباناً فما كسوتموني، ومریضاً ومحبوساً فما ررتموني!

حينئذ يجيبه هؤلاء أيضاً قائلين: يا رب، متى رأيناك جائعاً أو عطشاناً أو غريباً أو مريضاً أو محبوساً وما خدمناك؟

حينئذ يجيبهم قائلاً: الحق أقول لكم: كل ما لم تعملوه لأحد هؤلاء الصغار، فلي لم تعملوه.

ويذهب هؤلاء إلى العذاب الأبدي، والأبرار إلى الحياة الأبدية»
