Dear Beloved Parishioners

"Why do we call if *fast* when it goes so slow?" was a question that a young adult asked me a few years ago about our Lenten season.

For many of us all that we understand about Lent is that it is a time of penance and mortification for our souls and bodies which makes it unpleasant. Fast, abstinence and most ascetic activities seem to make us sad and put us in a sorrowful mood.

We know well that in Lent we enter more and more into ourselves to discover how far away we have become from our loving Father and his Son, our Savior Jesus Christ. Our disconnect throughout the year from the Source of Life creates in us sometimes a sort of fake independence. It makes us believe that there is no need for God or that God does not exist. This freedom develops, in fact, a sense of loss preventing us from being solely God's, leaving us in such spiritual disarray that we don't know how to return to the Father's house. The distractions of the world lure us away from God, giving us false promises of happiness and leaving us with a divided heart. Our hearts, the centers of emotion and will, begin seeking instant gratification and ignoring the true joy of the Lord.

It is actually the realization that we have strayed from him and have put the creatures above the creator that saddens our hearts and not the fasting and abstaining. When we become conscious through Scriptures and Lenten prayers of what we have missed by being apart from God, our hearts pain us.

Lent is that intense time when one gathers oneself together to make a comeback to discover God anew. It is similar to a relationship rejuvenation between a husband and wife when the difficulties and challenges of life have caused them to drift apart. These forty days of Lent become a re-dating period analogous to what couples may engage in after years of marriage when their love for each other has cooled and they have grown apart.

Lent, then, makes us aware of what we have missed from leading a life separate from God. Not only does it help to protect us from falling back, but also it repairs our relationship with the Lord.

That is why Lent is described in the Hoosoyo of the First Weekday Cycle of Lent as a shield of protection and a healing remedy.



During our short time on this earth, we prepare ourselves for the day when we shall stand before God to make an account of how we have spent our lives. In the meantime, we serve with love. The Church, founded by Christ, is the prime vehicle of this love, and of our service, and this is the sole purpose of the Eparchy of Saint Maron of Brooklyn.



Fifth Sunday Lent: Sunday of the Paralytic

First Letter to Timothy 5:24-6: 5

The sins of some people are conspicuous and precede them to judgement, while the sins of others follow them there. So also good works are conspicuous; and even when they are not, they cannot remain hidden. Let all who are under the yoke of slavery regard their masters as worthy of all honor, so that the name of God and the teaching may not be blasphemed. Those who have believing masters must not be disrespectful to them on the ground that they are members of the church; rather they must serve them all the more, since those who benefit by their service are believers and beloved. Teach and urge these duties. Whoever teaches otherwise and does not agree with the sound words of our Lord Jesus Christ and the teaching that is in accordance with godliness, is conceited, understanding nothing, and has a morbid craving for controversy and for disputes about words. From these come envy, dissension, slander, base suspicions, and wrangling among those who are deprayed in mind and bereft of the truth, imagining that godliness is a means of gain.

The Gospel according to Saint Mark 2:1-12

When Jesus returned to Capernaum after some days, it was reported that he was at home. So many gathered around that there was no longer room for them, not even in front of the door; and he was speaking the word to them. Then some people came, bringing to him a paralyzed man, carried by four of them. And when they could not bring him to Jesus because of the crowd, they removed the roof above him; and after having dug through it, they let down the mat on which the paralytic lay. When Jesus saw their faith, he said to the paralytic, 'Son, your sins are forgiven.' Now some of the scribes were sitting there, questioning in their hearts, 'Why does this fellow speak in this way? It is blasphemy! Who can forgive sins but God alone?' At once Jesus perceived in his spirit that they were discussing these questions among themselves; and he said to them, 'Why do you raise such questions in your hearts? Which is easier, to say to the paralytic, "Your sins are forgiven", or to say, "Stand up and take your mat and walk"? But so that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins' he said to the paralytic 'I say to you, stand up, take your mat and go to your home.' And he stood up, and immediately took the mat and went out before all of them; so that they were all amazed and glorified God, saying, 'We have never seen anything like this!'
