

## Dear Beloved Parishioners:

The last Sunday of the Season of Pentecost makes an excellent transition to the Season of the Exaltation of the Cross that started on Sunday even though the actual feast is not until Saturday, September 15.

When Jesus explained the Parable of the Sower to his disciples, surprisingly, he did not refer to who the sower was. The disciples asked him the meaning of the parable and he himself gave it in Luke 8: 11-15: "The seed is the word of God. The ones on the path are those who have heard; then the devil comes and takes away the word from their hearts, so that they may not believe and be saved. The ones on the rock are those who, when they hear the word, receive it with joy. But these have no root; they believe only for a while and in a time of testing fall away. As for what fell among the thorns, these are the ones who hear; but as they go on their way, they are choked by the cares and riches and pleasures of life, and their fruit does not mature. But as for that in the good soil, these are the ones who, when they hear the word, hold it fast in an honest and good heart, and bear fruit with patient endurance."

It is left up to the listeners to deduce the identity of the sower. Some assume that the sower is the Father, but others say it is the Son. In meditating on the wisdom and the spiritual richness in the way these passages are put together, we see that their inspiring sequence becomes a well that never runs dry. In my opinion, Jesus is the sower in the parable that was proclaimed on the thirteenth week of Pentecost which happened this year to be the last Sunday of the Season of Pentecost. Now, we come to the Gospel of the Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross. In John 12: 24, we hear Jesus saying, "Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit." In this passage Jesus does not speak about the soil and how it should be for the grain to give fruit.

At the end of the Season of Pentecost, Jesus is the sower generously planting an abundance of seed. However, in the beginning of the Season of the Exaltation of the Cross he has become the seed. This seed (grain of wheat) has the power to transform barren into fertile soil. It feels sometimes that Jesus grows *impatient* with us. When we do not accept what is good for us, he ends up telling us just what we must do to bear much fruit if we cooperate with him.



#### First Sunday after Holy Cross

##### The Second Letter to 2 Timothy 2: 1-10

Be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus; and what you have heard from me through many witnesses entrust to faithful people who will be able to teach others as well.

Share in suffering like a good soldier of Christ Jesus. No one serving in the army gets entangled in everyday affairs; the soldier's aim is to please the enlisting officer. And in the case of an athlete, no one is crowned without competing according to the rules.

It is the farmer who does the work who ought to have the first share of the crops.

Think over what I say, for the Lord will give you understanding in all things. Remember Jesus Christ, raised from the dead, a descendant of David that is my gospel, for which I suffer hardship, even to the point of being chained like a criminal. But the word of God is not chained.

Therefore I endure everything for the sake of the elect, so that they may also obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus, with eternal glory.

##### The Holy Gospel according to Saint Mark 10: 35-45

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came forward to Jesus and said to him, 'Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you.' And he said to them, 'What is it you want me to do for you?'

And they said to him, 'Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory.'

But Jesus said to them, 'You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with?'

They replied, 'We are able.' Then Jesus said to them, 'The cup that I drink you will drink; and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized; but to sit at my right hand or at my left is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared.'

When the ten heard this, they began to be angry with James and John.

So Jesus called them and said to them, 'You know that among the Gentiles those whom they recognize as their rulers lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. But it is not so among you; but whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all. For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many.'

قالا له: «نستطيع.» فقال لهما يسوع: «الكأس التي أنا أشربها ستشربانها، والمعمودية التي أنا أتعمد بها ستتعمدان بها.»

أما الجلوس عن يميني أو عن يساري، فليس لي أن أمحه إلا للذين أعد لهم.»

ولما سمع العشرة الآخرون، بدأوا يغتاضون من يعقوب ويوحنا.

ومن أراد أن يكون الأول بينكم، فليكن عبداً للجميع؛

لأن ابن الإنسان أيضاً لم يات ليخدم، بل ليخدم، ويبدل نفسه فداءً عن كثيرين.»
